

Noswaith dda, a chroeso i'r cyngerdd hwn.

Ym myd Cerddoriaeth Cadeirlan, bob blwyddyn daw eto byth yr her ddiddorol o geisio ysgrifennu rhywbeth newydd, a gobeithio, craff am gyngerdd sydd bellach yn gymaint o ran o'r allbwn Nadoligaidd arferol nes siawns bod popeth a ellir ei ddweud amdano wedi cael ei ddweud yn barod.

Mae'n anodd, hyd yn oed, i wahanu'r ffeithiau oddi wrth y straeon a'r chwedlau sydd ynghlwm â'r darn – oedd y Brenin Sior II (ynteu ai Tywysog Cymru oedd o?) mor feddw mewn un perfformiad iddo gamgymryd y corws Haleliwia am yr Anthem Genedlaethol, gan sefyll ar ei draed, a dyna gychwyn traddodiad sydd yn parhau hyd heddiw? Oedd cymaint o frys yn darparu'r copïau oherwydd newidiadau munud-diwethaf Handel yn golygu mai prin y gallai'r cerddorion eu darllen yn y perfformiad cyntaf, ac fe fu bron iddyn nhw wrthryfela? A oedd y darn yn cael ei weld gan gyfansoddwr oedd wedi chwythu'i blwc ac yn llawn dyled fel ymgais olaf i adfer ei yrfa wedi i bourgeoisie Llundain gefnu ar operâu yn yr arddull Eidalaidd? Mae llawer o ysgolheigion o fwy o fri na fi wedi ysgrifennu'n faith am wirionedd y pethau hyn, ond maent yn sicr yn gwneud stori wych ac yn dangos fel y mae'r campwaith mawr hwn wedi cydio yn nychymyg y cyhoedd am bron i dair canrif.

Er ei bod yn annhebygol y bydd y cyngerdd heno mor gythryblus â rhai o'r enghreifftiau hanesyddol hyn (ond rhowch gyfle iddo – mae'r bar ar agor), mae'n dal i fod yn llawenydd mawr i ailymweld â'r gerddoriaeth bendigedig hwn, yn arbennig yng nghwmni ffrindiau mewn lleoliad mor hardd â'r gadeirlan hon. Byddwn yn perfformio Rhan I, sydd yn delio â'r proffwydoliaeth a genedigaeth y Meseia, yn ei gyfanrwydd, gan ei ddilyn yn ail ran y cyngerdd gan ddetholiad o unawdau a chorws o Rannau II a III, sy'n ymdrin â'r Dioddefaint, yr Atgyfodiad ac Ail Ddyfodiad Crist.

Yr ydym wrth ein bodd yn croesawu Jeffrey Williams, Ysgolhaig Preswyl ar Ymweliad ym Mhrifysgol Bangor, i ymuno â ni ar gyfer ein perfformiad heno, ac fe fydd yn canu un o ariâu bas taranllyd nodweddiadol Handel, ond mae'r unawdwyr eraill oll yn aelodau arferol o Gôr y Gadeirlan, ac mae'n wych cael y cyfle i arddangos y doniau sydd gennym yn ein plith.

Good evening, and welcome to this concert.

It is one of the interesting annual challenges of Cathedral Music to try once again to write something new and, hopefully, insightful about a concert that has become so much a part of the regular Christmas output that surely everything that can be said about it has already been said.

It is difficult, even, to separate the facts from the lore and legend that surrounds the piece - was King George II (or was it the Prince of Wales?) really so drunk at one performance that he mistook the Hallelujah chorus for the National Anthem and stood up, starting a tradition that continues to this day? Were the copies so rushed from Handel's last-minute changes that the musicians could barely read them at the premiere and nearly revolted? Was it really conceived as a last-ditch attempt by a debt-ridden has-been to revive his career following the rejection of Italian-style opera by the bourgeoisie of London? Many scholars of much greater repute than I have written at length about the truth of these things, but they certainly make for a wonderful story and show how this great masterpiece has captured the public's imagination for nearly three centuries.

While it is unlikely that this evening's concert will be as eventful as some of these historical examples (though give it a chance - the bar is open), it is still always a great joy to revisit this wonderful music, particularly in the company of friends in a space as beautiful as this cathedral. We will be performing Part I, which deals with the prophecy and birth of the Messiah, in its entirety, followed in the second half of the concert by a selection of solos and chorus from Parts II and III, which deal with the Passion, the Resurrection and the Second Coming of Christ.

We are delighted to be joined for our performance this evening by Jeffrey Williams, Visiting Scholar in Residence at the University of Bangor, who will be singing one of Handel's trademark thunderous Bass arias, but all the other soloists are regular members of our Cathedral Choir, and it is wonderful to have the opportunity to showcase the talent that we have in our midst.


